Make a "black/white" chart of these chords in other keys.

Practice <u>all</u> chords in <u>all</u> keys, hands separately and hands together, blocked and broken (make up different patterns--Alberti bass pattern, for example). Repeat everything using inversions as well (see below). Do not try to do all this in one practice session. Keep a practice log and make a daily record of the keys and chords practiced. When you have mastered this you are ready for 7th chords (see 7th chord chart)!

Inversions

Inversions are indicated as follows in "fake" books:

C/E: The chord (first letter indicated) is C major, with E (second letter indicated) voiced on the bottom (this is called 1st inversion).

C/G: The chord is C major, with G voiced at the bottom (2nd inversion).

The bottom note is sometimes not part of the chord indicated. For example: C/F: Right hand plays a C chord; left hand plays a low F.
